

Grades 9-12: Modified Campus Schedule (Hybrid)

This is a high-level overview of what students and families can expect for learning experiences, feedback and assessment and communication in the Modified Campus Schedule (hybrid) model for grades 9-12.

Learning Experiences	Students will learn at school 2 days each week and learn at home 3 days each week.
Experiences	Learning at school
	 Grades 9-10 core content teachers (English Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies) will work as a team to design learning experiences for and/or with students that meet learning outcomes, maximize engagement, and personalize learning in whole class group, small groups or one-to-one. Grades 11-12 core content teachers (English Language Arts, Match, Science, Social Studies) will design learning experiences for and/or with students to meet learning outcomes, maximize engagement, and personalize learning experiences for and/or with students to meet learning outcomes, maximize engagement, and personalize learning in whole class group, small groups or one-to-one, including identifying opportunities for interdisciplinary learning experiences. Students will participate in elective courses on days they are learning at school, which may be offered onsite remotely or through in-person studio and lab experiences.
	 Hands-on, integrated learning experiences, as well as peer collaboration, will be prioritized for learning at school days.
	 Learning at home There will be on-demand (asynchronous) learning experiences with written and video directions for all courses. On Wednesdays, teachers may conduct additional, "live" (synchronous) learning for identified students based on specific needs. Teachers will use half the day for communicating with students and families and planning.
Feedback and Assessment	 Written, audio, video, and/or live feedback will be meaningful, specific, timely and focus on next action. Teachers will assess where each student is and where they are going in their learning and provide opportunities for students to independently demonstrate what they have learned.
Student and Family Communication	 Weekly Teachers will check in with each student/family to ensure they understand expectations, feedback, and progress. A weekly overview will include weekly schedule, connections to previous learning and hints for how to organize time, etc. This will be posted by the end of the day on Fridays. Teachers will use Wednesdays for communication with families, real-time, "live" learning opportunities for students based on need, planning and professional learning. Ongoing The Schoology learning platform will be used consistently. Teachers will respond to family and student questions within 24 hours on school days. Communication will be personalized to reach each family (written, audio, video, or live communication). Translation: Language Line will be used for phone conversations. University Language Center will be used for WebEx meetings.
