WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

F.R.E.S.H. Skills

Children can participate in five areas of focus: fitness, respect, expression, safety and helping hands. Summer Trek students can earn merit awards as they participate in the different F.R.E.S.H. skills.

Scholar's Medal (Grades 1-7)

Using materials from Summer Bridge Activities series of workbooks, kids continue using their reading, writing, math and language skills.

Swimming and W.O.W.

Most Tuesdays and Thursdays, students in grades 1-7 may choose to swim at the Spring Lake Park High School pool. On several Wednesdays throughout the summer, all students can participate in W.O.W., or Wheels on Wednesday, where they can bring bikes, scooters, rollerblades and ride through the blocked-off parking lot.

Kindergarten Readiness (Discovery Days)

Children will engage in activites for reading, writing, math and language learning in order to be ready for kindergarten.

Weekly Field Trips and/or Special Events

No extra fees! Summer Trek staff strives to make summer vacation exciting with on-site activities and events and off-site field trips. SUMMER LEARNING VENTURES NEED TO KNOW Eligibility

Summer Trek is open to children ages 5-12 years who have completed kindergarten and not yet entered 7th grade.

Summer Discovery Days is open to preschool children age 3-5 years who have not yet entered kindergarten.

Registration

Our child care programs have a limited number of full-time and part-time spots. Upon confirmation by our registration staff that there is a spot for your child, the registration will be processed and the registration fee will be collected. Registrants will receive an email confirmation that the registration is complete.
