ACADEMIC PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Spring Lake Park High School is on a Trimester System. One credit is given per class per trimester. Students have honors and AP options beginning in ninth grade in all of the core course subject areas, including language arts, social studies, math, science and world language. College Credit Options

Several courses taught at Spring Lake Park High School offer students both high school and college credit. Students are expected to perform at the college level. Students will receive a Certificate of Credit if they meet the college credit requirements.

Spanish Immersion

Students who have been involved in the Spring Lake Park Schools Spanish Immersion programming will be welcomed to Spring Lake Park High with a series of rigorous and engaging courses instructed in the target language of Spanish. We have designed and prepared courses that will meet and extend upon their language acquisition.

AVID

AVID is a global nonprofit organization dedicated to closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college and other postsecondary opportunities. AVID supports the district's vision of college readiness for each student, and the ultimate end goal of having each student complete 12 college credits by the end of 12th grade (12x12).

Opportunities in Emergency Care (OEC)

OEC is an award-winning medical education program. We offer extensive opportunities to students interested in serving others in the healthcare field. We teach EMS (Emergency Medical Services) programs to regional high school students. Students can learn basic First Aid, or become fully prepared for pursuing careers in clinics, hospitals, nursing homes, in-home healthcare, ambulance services, fire departments, etc. through our courses. Students can earn college credits and/or their NREMT (National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician) certification, which enables them to pursue careers in various EMS and healthcare professions. Based in Spring Lake Park High School, we educate in-district, as well as out-of-district students from many other regional high schools.

TESTING - ACT AND AP

ACT testing was postponed due to COVID-19 restrictions. No information is available for the SAT due to the small number of students who take this exam. There were 102 students who took the PSAT exam in 2020.

A total of 633 AP exams were taken in 2020. Four students were recognized as an National AP Scholars, 31 were recognized as AP Scholars with Distinction, 11 students were recognized as AP Scholars with Honor, and 52 students were recognized as AP Scholars.
